WHAT DOES THE PARISH COUNCIL DO?

Odiham Parish Council owns and manages some community assets and amenities on behalf of residents. These include play areas, the recreation ground, cemetery, public toilets and pockets of land, e.g. an area of the Firs and at Colt Hill. We are a statutory consultee on planning applications. Our responses are informed by the Neighbourhood Plan since the Plan involved widespread consultation and the result was tested by a Parish referendum. Residents can ask to address any Council meeting including on planning. Dates and details are on the website and posted before each meeting on the OPC noticeboards in Odiham High Street and North Warnborough.

The Council works with other authorities on the provision of services and amenities such as traffic management, parking, street cleaning, street lighting and Odiham and Broad Oak commons.

All Councillors were independent candidates nominated to stand in the elections on 2 May. There were 10 nominations for 10 seats so Hart declared that we were each "elected without a contest" hence there was no parish election. We became the new OPC from 7 May 2019.

- Undertaking consultations on major proposals to help ensure evidence-based decision making;
- Continuing to ensure OPC supports events organised by individuals and organisations within the Parish such as the Extravaganza, Spooktacula, Armed Forces Day and Bands in the Bury;
- Respecting the Odiham and North Warnborough Neighbourhood Plan because it was overwhelmingly endorsed by the Community.

Staffing changes

After 7 years of service to the community and Parish Council, The Executive Officer, Mrs Sarah Weir, has left Odiham for pastures new. We thank her and offer her our best wishes for the future. In the interim we have been joined by Mrs Mary Harris who is acting as Locum Clerk until we find a new Parish Clerk

Speeding in the Village

OPC is monitoring vehicle speeds and traffic volumes around the Parish with our Speed Indicator Device (SID). Data from the recent deployment on Dunley's Hill showed speed is an issue there which has been reported to the police. Please let us know of roads in the Parish where you'd like to see the SID installed. You may have seen the latest deployment on the High Street near London road.

New Bus Shelter

Funding has been accepted to place a new bus shelter on the Alton Road opposite the site of the former Crown public house for buses coming from the Alton direction. We are awaiting confirmation of the installation date.

Cemetery Rules

Following research into common practice elsewhere, practice over recent years and input from residents, the Council has made some small adjustments to the Cemetery Rules. These include allowing black granite and slightly larger headstones, both of which are already common in the Cemetery. The restriction on engraving on the rear of headstones was also lifted. The full rules can be found on the website. We hope these adjustments will enable families to remember their loved ones in ways they see fit whilst preserving the special nature of Odiham's historic, lawned Cemetery.

Tennis Courts

A new lease with Odiham Tennis Club will pass responsibility for day to day management of the courts to the Club. One of these courts is available for public use and will be booked and paid for online instead of through the Parish Office. This will make it easier and quicker to book a court and support the Tennis Club in its aim to get more residents playing tennis.
