TT05/21 Update on current Traffic and Transport matters:

EVCPS:

Still in progress.

Speeding on B3349 – Working Group:

Cllrs W Macphee and J Raw, the Deputy Clerk and Tom Davidson from RAF Odiham met Andy Smith from Hampshire Safer Roads on Wednesday 5th May to discuss the Village Gateway scheme, an additional measure to try to encourage drivers to reduce their speed when entering Odiham on the B3349. The idea was presented to Full Council on 15th June where it was agreed to have one set of gates south of RAF Odiham on the B3349 and to look at another two sets of gates at all the entrance roads to the Parish. It was also agreed to investigate whether the speed limit on the approach to RAF Odiham from Alton could be reduced to 30 mph.

Tunnel Lane – measures to control parking.

Cllr Stewart reported that the resident who had originally brought the issue to OPC had sourced the wooden logs and transportation and was waiting for a price to be confirmed for the wood.

- i) To explore the suggestion for new herringbone parking lines on the High Street with the aim of increasing safety and parking provision on the High Street and as identified in the draft Odiham Village Centre Action Plan.
- ii) To agree whether to write to Hart DC requesting it be considered.

It was commented that herringbone parking lines would help to improve road safety, it would be a traffic calming measure and would encourage better parking that would allow optimum use of the parking bays on the High Street.
