Apologies were received from Cllrs A Fraser and J Raw and were accepted.

- TT25/21 Approval of minutes**
RESOLVED
The minutes of the Traffic & Transport Committee meeting held on 22nd June 2021 (TT01/21–TT21/21) were agreed as true record of the meeting to be signed by the Chair in person at a later date.
(Proposed by Cllr Stewart, seconded by Cllr Macphee, all agreed).
- TT26/21 Meeting Action Points:**
Was reviewed as presented with the agenda.
- TT27/21 EVCPs**
The Deputy Clerk's report on the update on the installation of EVCPs in Odiham carparks was noted. Councillors discussed the recent decision by Hart DC to request EVCPs as part of the Crownfields development and requested more information on Hart's planning policy regarding the inclusion of EVCPs on all future developments.
- TT28/21 Community Speedwatch**
Councillors reviewed the Deputy Clerk's report on recent Speedwatch data and Councillors agreed that the data table should be published on the OPC website. It was also suggested that an example of the speeding letter sent by the police should be requested to be posted on the website. It was also agreed that active volunteers in the Community Speedwatch group could be potential recipients of the community awards and should be forwarded to the Community Awards subcommittee.

It was also agreed to publish more photos on social media to raise awareness and to encourage more volunteers.



It was noted that volunteers were not keen to monitor Dunley's Hill in the risk assessed standing area due to the noise, (volunteers could not hear each other) proximity to the road and the speed of traffic. Councillors agreed that the safety of the volunteers was paramount and that new standing areas would need to be suggested if Dunley's Hill was to be monitored by the Speedwatch group.

TT29/21 Speeding on the B3349

Councillors agreed to the payment of the £250 application fee to Hampshire CC to start the design process for the village gateway and noted the next meeting with Hampshire Highways was on 5th October to review the project.

It was agreed to discuss the request to review the extension of the 30mph speed limit on the B3349 at the next Traffic Partnership meeting.

Resolved:

To recommend to Full Council that OPC authorises payment of the £250 application fee to Hampshire CC to begin designs for the Village Gateway.

TT30/21 Crumplins Meadow Road crossing

Councillors noted Cllr Glen's request to Hampshire CC to review the road safety issue on Dunley's Hill outside the Crumplins Meadow housing development. (email forwarded to Councillors separately) and agreed to discuss further at the next Traffic Partnership meeting.

TT31/21 Increase in carpark charges and impact on The Bury.

Councillors noted the meeting with Hart DC in the Bury on 23rd September to review parking congestion in The Bury that may have been exacerbated by the increase in parking charges.

TT32/21 Traffic Partnership Meeting

Councillors noted 13th October date for the next Traffic Partnership meeting and amended the Traffic Partnership Group Terms of Reference and agreed to recommend to Full Council for approval.
