Hampshire & IoW Village of the Year Special award for excellence in Community engagement





- Committee continues to meet every 3 weeks on Zoom. Some applications referred to full Council in order to meet statutory deadlines.
- Members of the public are welcome to join meetings online.
- Since May 2023, 104 housing applications and 23 tree applications have been considered.
- There have been further applications to comply with conditions OPC has only commented on these applications if they objected to the original application.
- Research professional support to OPC in their consideration of large future applications coming forward. OPC must wait for an application to be submitted in order to assess any application before determining their course of action. OPC is aware of local opinion for large planning applications.

#### Other work:

- Received £14,261 Section 106 developers' contributions from the Crownfields development.
   This is going towards a village gateway scheme on the Alton Road and a grant towards The Bridewell conversion into community use.
- Lobbying MP's for a joined up national policy on solar generation of electricity, including solar far
- Supporting the community's bid to save The Bell Public House.

- 2022 2023 Annual Monitoring Report available online. This year's Monitoring Report has not yet been completed due to the ongoing review of the Neighbourhood Plan.
- Policy 2 Housing Development Sites:
  - Site (i) Land at Longwood No application submitted.
  - Sites (ii) Land at 4 Western Lane Site completed and fully occupied.
  - Site (iii) Crumplins Yard Properties occupied.
  - Site (iv) Land at Albion Farm A Pre-app has been submitted for four large custom, self-build dwellings but no advice has yet been given by Hart District Council.



- Policy 2 Housing Development Sites:
  - Sites (v) Land at Dunleys Hill Outline planning permission was submitted but the plans were not in accordance with the Neighbourhood Plan and was refused by Hart District Council. There was no offer to provide the Public Open Space in Policy 14 of The Neighbourhood Plan. It is expected that the developers may go to Appeal.
  - Site (vi) Land at Hook Road Two applications have been submitted for this site and are in the process of being considered by Hart.
  - Site (vii) Land next to Crownfields 19/02257/OUT All conditions imposed at the Outline stage have been discharged and the road access has been completed. It is expected that development will begin in the near future.



#### NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN REVIEW

- Light touch review following a "health check" report Autumn 2023.
- £10,000 Government grant awarded.
- 6 week public consultation ran from 22nd January to 7th March. 44 responses.
- Currently reviewing all responses to the consultation with the planning consultant and Hart District Council to decide what changes are necessary.
- Further work to meet Hart's document accessibility requirements is being carried out by the consultant.



#### **NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN REVIEW**

- Following the responses OPC decided to investigate the possibility of including more sites for possible Local Green Space designation. Following recommended methodology and site assessment criteria a further 13 sites will be put forward in the Plan for the next stage of Consultation.
- Once the review has been completed and all changes are made, the Plan will go to a full Parish Council meeting for approval. Following that it will be submitted to Hart District Council who will then begin their consultation process. After that an Examiner will be instructed to review the updated Plan.
- It is hoped to pass the Plan to Hart at the middle of May.


