## Chair's welcome, Cllr Angela McFarlane cont...

In other news, there have been changes to the way the Basingstoke Canal is managed and funded.

Councils that have the canal flowing through their patch are asked to make a contribution to maintenance, but not all do. Odiham has decided to continue to make an annual payment at the level originally estimated by the Canal Authority according to the length of the canal in the Parish. This decision, in a difficult funding climate, was based on the importance of the canal to the local community as a leisure amenity. It is rated as one of the most picturesque canals in the country. The towpath is well used by walkers and cyclists as well as those who take to the water in a variety of craft. We are grateful to the Basingstoke Canal Society, a charity run entirely by volunteers, for the amazing job they do to maintain the canal as a navigable water way such as clearing vegetation.

However, I have a personal request. Please can dog walkers keep their dogs from swimming in the canal? The frequent in and out of dogs is a major cause of erosion of the banks which require expensive repairs. I recently counted 23 such areas of damage between Swan Bridge and the Castle. This is not the only problem I know but it is one that we dog owners can help with. Thank you.



## The 2025-2026 Parish Precept

Every year the Parish Council is required to set an annual budget which determines the precept charged to residents. The precept is calculated using a Band D average which estimates the number of homes in the Parish and this figure is provided by Hart District Council who act as the charging authority to collect payments.

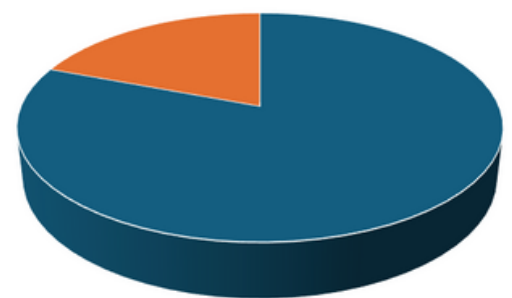
Odiham Parish Council's 2025-26 budget is set at £301,506 which will be funded by a precept of £243,566, with £57,940 budgeted income from other sources such as burials, The Bridewell bookings, allotments and bank interest. This represents an annual precept charge of £101.78 for Band D properties.

The 8.36% increase includes direct increases in running costs, for employee national insurance costs, property insurance and the management of buildings and local open space facilities.

The Council is pleased to continue supporting the following groups and activities next year:

- £4,500 grants to InOdiham for Bands in The Bury, Odiham Food Festival and Extravaganza.
- £2,000 community grants to support small projects which benefit local people.
- Financial support to Citizens Advice.
- Projects which support RAF Odiham personnel.
- Financial support for the management of Odiham Common, Broad Oak Common and The Basingstoke Canal.
- Street lighting.

## Hampshire and the Solent devolution consultation

You may have seen reports of Devolution in Hampshire in other news channels and asked what this really means?

Hampshire County Council Leader says "Devolution promises to bring huge opportunities, money and growth to our region – boosting people's quality of life for generations to come, and Hampshire is on the fast-track to benefit."

Residents can now have their say in the Government's devolution consultation on proposals to create a new Strategic Authority for the wider region of Hampshire, Portsmouth, Southampton and Isle of Wight.



OPC discussed the consultation on 26th February and concluded that they should seek more information on the implications of the proposed changes. We plan to revisit this on 18th March.

The consultation runs for eight weeks from 17 February 2025 to 11:59pm on 13 April 2025.

Councillors awarded £830 of community grants at the Council meeting in January.

£580 was awarded to The Baker Hall for a solar project to reduce costs and to become more environmentally friendly.

£250 was awarded to The Mustard Seed Autism Trust, to replace a laptop to create resources and information for the website for autistic children and their families.

## Work experience in the Parish Office

I am a year 12 / first year student at Farnborough College of Technology, and I am enrolled in a Level 3 Business BTEC extended diploma. As part of my course, we must complete 2 weeks of unpaid work experience with a local company / business to gain knowledge in their field.

Working at Odiham Parish Council for 2 weeks has helped me with certain admin skills, data entry, site management and more. The work environment is relaxed however the work ethic still runs high. My peers have been very helpful and have been there to assist me with uncertainty on tasks.



I rather enjoyed the design aspect of my work placement, for example when I was tasked with making ads for the Hot-desk service, and this task helped me learn more about commercial advertising and graphic design / formatting.

I also enjoyed the data entry aspect of the work as I got to use problem solving to reach better conclusions, and I improved my knowledge on invoices and spreadsheets.

I had the opportunity to go out on Odiham Parish Council sites to do Health and Safety checks, damage, cleanliness etc. This is an important part of the role as ensuring the amenities are in order means the public won't have to worry as much about living in a dirty, unsafe and damaged area. I am fortunate that I was given the opportunity to work here temporarily, but also fortunate as I met new people, for example the people of Odiham & North Warnborough, or the Councillors which I met at the full council meeting. Getting to hear citizens, councillors, and people from different political positions across the county speak on their ideas and queries, gave me some good insight on what can come up in council and learnt about some of the more important things for local governments.

Overall, I enjoyed my time at Odiham Parish Council, and I am very grateful for the skills and the time I have had here. I strongly believe this experience will help me in my studies for college, and will help for any future employment with the right skills. I would like to give my special thanks to Andrea, Clerk and Bridie, Deputy Clerk for leading the way these 2 weeks.

# Amenity Areas

## Play Areas

As part of our ongoing commitment to maintaining community assets, we have recently had works carried out in some of the play parks.

At the **Bufton Field** play area, the safety surfaces were professionally cleaned, with sections repaired, the hopscotch was repainted and a new swing seat installed.



The **Recreation Ground** play area required sections of the timber play equipment to be replaced and orders have been placed to repaint the multi-tower unit and remove the zip wire - we expect works to be completed early Spring.

Works at the **Chamberlain Gardens** play area included shrub maintenance to improve access, new site signage, repainting the bench and re-fixing safety surfacing. Tree works are also planned. We are aware that this is a very popular play area close to schools and the equipment would benefit from an upgrade and we keep a look out for funding opportunities.



We have some great news to report about the **Chapel Pond** play area! Through discussions with a developer of two development sites on Hook Road, and with the support from Hart District Council, we hope to secure £88,000 in developers' contributions for parish leisure which will fund the cost of upgrading this site. The decision was confirmed as part of a planning decision and confirmed through the section 106 agreement, expected soon. The project will be progressed as soon as the Council has received funds and this could be later this year. Follow our news pages for updates.

Having liability for such a wide range of outdoor facilities is a resource intense responsibility for the Council - for Council staff and budgets. The 2025-26 grounds maintenance budget is almost £30,000 just for the open spaces and play areas alone. Typical costs include grounds maintenance and inspections to check for issues.

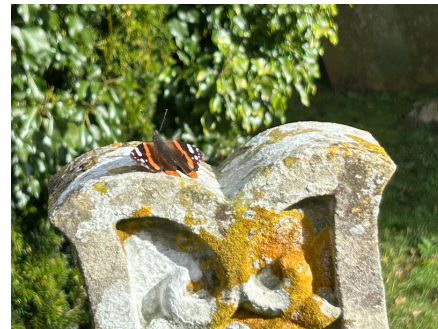
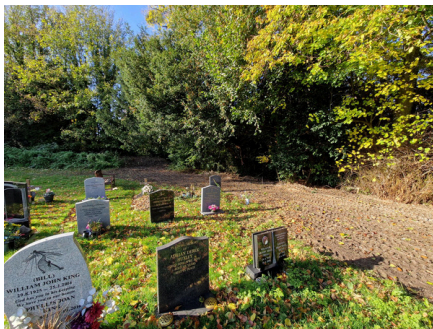

## Odiham Cemetery



Our focus on improving Odiham Cemetery has also continued. Aimed at improving access to the cemetery for maintenance, a number of plots within the western area of the cemetery were topped up with topsoil, compacted, levelled and then finished with grass seed.

This process was carried out by our grounds contractor Larkstel who completed the work by hand to minimise the risk of any damage to plots. The sinking of plots is a normal part of the settling of the graves over time and usually happens within the first 12 months of a burial.



Other recent works includes repairs to fencing at the [Hook Road allotment site](#) and general maintenance and repairs at the [Peace Garden](#) in time for Remembrance.



## Odiham War Memorial

As reported in our previous newsletter, the War Memorial Working Group was formed in 2024 to draw up an action plan for improving the condition and general state of the war memorial with the aim of preserving this important piece of local history. Thanks to the wonderful volunteers there is now a team of volunteers in place to provide the much needed TLC.

However, the second part of the project (to develop a longer-term strategy to repair and restore the fabric of the memorial) has not been so straightforward. A condition survey carried out by local volunteer Derek Begent identified works far in excess of the Council's budgets. An expression of interest has recently been sent to the War Memorials Trust to see if its possible to secure external funding which will enable the memorial to remain a fitting place for reflection and tribute for future generations.

## New contract awards

During the Winter months a full, open tender process was carried out for the two grounds maintenance contracts; one for Odiham Cemetery and one for all other Council owned sites. Following assessment and interviews with the shortlisted contractors, we are pleased to report that Scandor Landscapes has been appointed for Odiham Cemetery and Larkstel Ltd will continue providing services for all other Council owned sites.

# What is a Parish Lengthsman?

Previously, we have described what our parish Conservation Volunteer Group has been up to – and yes, it is re-starting soon, so do register your interest! Connected, but separate, some of you may have heard, seen or read about how OPC employ ‘Parish Lengthsmen’ or are part of the ‘Parish Lengthsman Scheme’, and perhaps you wonder what on earth is a Parish Lengthsman? And then, if you’re like me, you’ll forget all about it until you hear the words again..... So, a very quick ditty, with a bit of help from Wikipedia (other reference sources are available) for those of you with interest in what is actually a long-standing piece of English history.

The term Lengthsman was coined in the 1700s from a concept rooted in the Tudor Era as far back as War of the Roses. Originally, it referred to someone who kept a "length" of road, track or canal neat, tidy and passable in the Middle Ages, with particular emphasis on boundary marking. On land, a Lengthsman might be responsible for a few miles between adjacent villages and especially on commonage. Employed originally by the Lords of the Manor, and latterly in these more enlightened, and democratic times, by parish councils, they would keep grass and weeds down in verges, keep drainage ditches clear and repair fences. Litter, such as it was in those times, was cleared and instances are recorded of wild flowers being planted and tended to make the area look well-tended.



The history of parish Lengthsmen was reinvigorated back to the early 1900s, when Lengthsmen, who lived in their parishes, were again given lengths of local highway and tasked to keep their sections of road in good condition. Over time, with greater mechanisation and declining budgets – sound familiar? – the service began to fall into decline, and by the late 1960s had ceased to operate in Hampshire.....

The decision to introduce a modern version of that service, initially as two pilot schemes in the Meon and Test Valley areas, was taken in April 2009. The aim of the scheme was to improve local responsiveness; reduce pressure on core highway services; and to enhance the local environment by putting finance, labour and decisions about prioritising low-level highway maintenance under direct control of parishes.

The initial pilots were reviewed in 2011 and identified that the success of the scheme not only depends on having a reliable, well briefed and capable Lengthsman, but also on timely communications between all parties involved. It also recognised the important role the lead parish plays in appointing the Lengthsman, liaising with the participating parishes, and co-ordinating work schedules and providing feedback to the County Council.



A list of duties which a parish Lengthsman undertakes include sign cleaning, drainage and minor highway works, for example cutting back vegetation and grass strimming, all of which fall under the responsibility of the County Council. They also undertake other environmental work, such as litter picking, graffiti removal, maintaining play areas, benches, bus shelters - all of which fall under the responsibility of district or and parish councils. Health and safety is paramount and therefore the scheme prohibits Lengthsmen from undertaking any structural repairs or any work on the ‘live’ carriageway, and from undertaking any work to street lighting or illuminated signs.

Our Parish Lengthsman is **Jason Ebury** of **Premier Grounds Maintenance**: Jason is a very experienced Lengthsman and covers a number of parishes, OPC included. So now, when you hear about what our Lengthsman is up to in the Parish, doing great work for the benefit of the community, you know a bit more about them. As we say where I work, “Every day is a school day”....



## Invictus Games 2025

We were all behind Team UK when they took part in the recent Invictus Games in Vancouver, Canada in February - the first ever Winter games.

We were especially proud to support participant and Odiham Parish Council Cllr Mike Tate who competed in the wheelchair rugby and indoor rowing.

We welcomed Cllr Tate back to the February Council meeting when Cllr McFarlane formally congratulated Cllr Tate on behalf of the Council for his silver medal in the wheelchair rugby event.
