



**MINUTES OF THE COUNCIL MEETING OF ODIHAM PARISH COUNCIL HELD

189/25 Apologies for absence

Received and accepted from Cllrs Seabrook and Tate. Cllrs McFarlane and Tyler had advised they would arrive later.
Apologies were also noted from Hart District Council (HDC) Cllr Highley.

190/25 Declarations of interests and requests for dispensation

191/25 Approval of minutes

RESOLVED

The minutes of the Council meeting held on 18th November 2025 (163-188/25) were approved as a true record of the meeting and signed by the meeting Chair.
(Proposed by Cllr Verdon, seconded by Cllr Cornall, 3 in favour).

192/25 Chair's announcements

Cllr Verdon gave thanks to:

- i) The Hook & Odiham Lions for helping with the Christmas tree decorating.
- ii) The Rotary Club of Hook & Odiham for supporting the tree lighting event with Santa's sleigh and to Cove Brass Band for their performance.
- iii) OPC staff for arranging the Christmas drinks reception to thank local volunteers.
- iv) Cllr McFarlane for writing the successful grant application to HDC for £5,000 towards improvements to the small woodland at The Firs.
- v) Cllr Bell for writing the successful grant nomination to HDC for £2,500 towards the cost of improving path conditions on a section of Bartley Heath.

195/25 Reports from other councils

- a. HCC Cllr Glen had sent a written report (Appendix 1) prior to the meeting and further reported:
 - i) HCC would not be applying for an extension to defer the HCC elections beyond its current extension to May 2027. A decision on the schedule of elections was expected end of January.
 - ii) Long Sutton and Well Parish Councils had objected to the proposed time rally in the area. Cllr Verdon confirmed OPC had already been notified.



- iii) Cllr Glen was in regular communication with the Villages Oppose Warehouses (VoW) campaign group.
 - iv) Cllr Glen supported the OPC/RAF Odiham campaign for an extension to the current 30mph limit on B3349, extending to include the RAF Odiham junction, and had passed on his support to HCC officers.
- b. HDC Cllr Dorn reported:
- i) Cllr Dorn urged members to watch the Government's speech on its announcement to delay the Mayoral election in Hampshire and said, as far as he was aware, the HCC elections would go ahead in 2026 followed by the Mayoral election in 2027.
 - ii) An Armed Forces Covenant conference was planned on 10th March 2026 to bring together service providers, veterans, families, and other interested parties.
 - iii) HDC had prosecuted residents for failing to comply with fly tipping notices.
 - iv) HDC had published their dates for bin collections over the Christmas season and urged OPC to share the dates.

197/25 Casual Vacancy for the RAF Station ward

The co-option advertisement for the RAF Station ward councillor's position was noted, following confirmation from Hart Electoral Services that no by-election has been requested. The Clerk reported that one application had been received since agenda publication which would be added to the January Council agenda with any other applications received.

RESOLVED

OBJECTION

Rushmoor Borough's Local Plan, which has been endorsed through public enquiry, contains the following policy SP4.2(4);

Maintain the same differential movement limit between weekday and weekends and bank holidays so that the proportion of weekend and bank holiday movements will not exceed 18% of the total overall maximum annual flight movement limit, excluding 'Other Aviation Activity'.

The current restrictions exist to protect residents' weekend and bank-holiday amenity, when aircraft noise is most intrusive, particularly in summer. This application does not seek to raise the annual flight cap, and Farnborough Aerodrome remains well below its 50,000-movement limit. There is therefore no economic justification for removing a long-established policy that provides residents with essential respite.

If Rushmoor Borough Council's Development Control Committee chooses to approve the proposal, it must do so in full knowledge that it conflicts with its adopted Local Plan. That plan was publicly examined, formally approved, and remains a very strong material consideration.

Natural England has already identified adverse impacts on Annex 1 bird breeding success from aircraft noise. Although the application does not increase total annual flights, it would increase weekend flights—precisely when the SPA experiences the highest visitor pressure. Large areas of the most overflowed heath are closed during the week for military training, meaning disturbance peaks at weekends through off-lead dogs and increased human activity, which in turn enables corvid predation. Adding more aircraft noise at this peak period heightens risk and cannot be dismissed without evidence.

Planning inspectors have repeatedly emphasised the need to cap weekend flights, reflected in policy SP4.2's 18% weekend-movement limit. The only claimed benefit is general economic growth for the operator, implying higher actual annual usage and therefore greater cumulative impact on protected bird species. The improvements to the Community Finding Scheme and Social Value fund etc are helpful, but very little has been awarded to Hart groups over the years. (Proposed by Cllr Verdon, seconded by Cllr Cornall, all in favour).

209/25 **Planning applications due for response before the next Planning & Development Committee**

The following applications were presented and it was agreed to defer consideration until the next Planning & Development Committee on 13th January:

-Proposed change of use of ground floor from Class E(a) (retail) to Class C3 (residential), or reinstatement of historic residential/retail boundary; alterations to



High Street frontage including removal of bay window elements and installation of traditional sash windows, low brick boundary wall and wrought iron railings; internal alterations including installation of reversible partitions and reconfiguration of 1990's rear extension; and demolition of rear store and construction of oak-framed orangery.

- ii) 25/02502/CA - Land At Seymour Place Odiham Hook Hampshire RG29 1AY
Various tree works.

210/25 Deed of Variation – land west of Alton Road

RESOLVED

The Deed of Variation for the Neighbourhood Plan development site at Crownfields, as requested by the Hart/Basingstoke legal team, was approved and would be signed in accordance with Standing Orders. This item had been deferred from the previous meeting to allow time for Cllr Verdon to seek clarification of the change and Cllr Verdon had spoken with the case officer and developer directly.

(Proposed by Cllr Verdon, seconded by Cllr Cornall, all in favour).

The Clerk reported that the Hart/Basingstoke legal team would issue the documentation for signature.

211/25 Updates on Asset of Community Value (ACV) nominations

Updates were provided on the two ACV nominations agreed by Council earlier in the year:

RESOLVED

- i) The Bridewell – to proceed with a nomination in order to protective the property for community use under the successive Council and noting an ACV status was beneficial
- ii) Colt Hill boatyard – to defer a nomination until the anticipated changes to planning legislation were understood.

(Proposed by Cllr Verdon, seconded by Cllr Cornall, all in favour).

Traffic and Transport

212/25 20mph schemes and other traffic calming

The Clerk gave an update on behalf of the working group.

- Since the previous meeting, a grant application had been made to the Police & Crime Commissioner's road safety grant for improvements to the informal crossing points on West St, outside Robert Mays School.
- RAF Odiham had accepted OPC's suggestion and submitted their own application for two courtesy crossing points; one at the top of Churchill Avenue and one further down Churchill Avenue to link up with Love Lane. The Clerk had supported the application process and a letter of support had been submitted from OPC.
- The community survey had ended. There were 398 responses which had been reviewed by the office and due to be reviewed by the working group in the New Year.
- The Clerk had prepared a draft report which would be discussed by the working group early next year with the view of drawing up a list of proposed actions in some areas.
- The final report would aim to produce a local policy of desired traffic calming measures including a mix of parish led schemes, to evidence spending on SIDs and Speedwatch, to support developer contributions requests, and to support campaigns to the highways authority.



213/25 **Bartley Heath Pathway**

- i) Cllr Bell presented details of the project to improve ground conditions on a section of pathway running through Bartley Heath which was impassable for most of the year.

Three options were considered; for a boardwalk, repair hardstanding, or do nothing. It was agreed that improved hardstanding was the most economic and sustainable option. The works included re-laying 70m of hardcore and were estimated to cost £2,500. Cllr Bell further reported that HDC had confirmed funding for the project earlier in the day.

- ii) A Dawson from the HCC Countryside Services team gave a presentation on their work on the HCC rural paths network, funding challenges, and a breakdown of issues reporting on local paths running through the Parish. Mr Dawson explained that only 25p from every £100 collected by HCC in council tax was spent on Countryside Services.

Mr Dawson would be supporting the Bartley Heath project and explained that various permissions were required when working on Common Land.

Councillors offered to inspect each of the outstanding matters on local paths and report back with photos. The Clerk was asked to forward the presentation to councillors who would report back with the paths they could help with.

Mayoral elections to be postponed

Government has informed us that they are considering delaying the planned elections for new Mayors in four areas of England, including Hampshire and the Solent.

This means that the mayoral elections planned for our area in May 2026, as part of our devolution journey, have a strong likelihood of being postponed by two years, until May 2028.

The Government has indicated that this decision has been made to enable the Local Government Reorganisation (LGR) process to be completed first, before Mayors take office.

As you know, LGR and devolution are separate things: LGR is about creating new unitary councils to replace the 15 local authorities currently in place across Hampshire, Southampton, Portsmouth and the Isle of Wight, while devolution is to do with drawing down from central Government more powers and funding to regional areas to support local skills, the economy, and growth opportunities.

Our County Council elections in May 2026 are still expected to take place on 7 May 2026, as planned, with the county's 1.4 million residents going to polls to elect 78 county councillors across 76 electoral divisions.

What this means for devolution

The process of devolution across Hampshire and the Solent is expected to continue, and the new Strategic Authority will be developed under the Governance and decision making by the councils of Hampshire County, Southampton City, , Portsmouth City, and the Isle of Wight Council. However, some of the expected timings within this process may change. We are now still seeking clarity on what these changes may be and the impact they may have. Watch this space!

What this means for Local Government Reorganisation

At the moment, we expect that the timeline for Local Government Reorganisation will remain as it is now, with the 'vesting day' (launch) of the new councils in May 2028.

The Government has made it clear that they would like LGR to be complete before Mayors take office. Again, if any updates or changes to the expected process are made, I will share the details as soon as I know them.

What this means for us

I am aware this is a change of plan from Government, and a frustration for residents across Hampshire and the Solent. We are grateful to everyone who has put considerable time and effort into driving our Devolution Programme and putting in all the groundwork to ensure we were on track for delivering this in 2026.

Although we now need to understand the implications of the Government's announcement, we are sure much of this work remains absolutely necessary, as Government still intends to deliver devolution arrangements through newly created Strategic Authorities next year, with or without a Mayor.

Please be assured that this delay is unlikely to have any local impacts on the work that HCC is doing locally,

- **Day-to-day services continue as normal.** The work that we do for Hampshire's residents matters immensely and remains my top priority.
- **Preparation continues.** HCC will continue to prepare for both devolution and LGR so that we are ready to move promptly once timelines are confirmed.

The ongoing story of devolution and LGR may feel rather remote, so thank you for taking an interest in this important programme. Soon we will have a better of the future process as we move into the brave new world of local government.

In spite of all this, I wish you all the best for a Happy New Year!
